

Lafayette Parish Sheriff's Office Law Enforcement Explorer Program



The Sheriff is dedicated to the education of young adults in regard to law enforcement awareness and community service. This education includes an exposure to state and local laws, the operations of each component within the LPSO, officer safety tactics, crime prevention measures, criminal apprehension, positive community interactions, and more. Employees of the LPSO volunteer and interact with Explorers as mentors and educate them through shadowing programs as well as training curriculums.

Qualifications

Age: Law Enforcement Exploring is open according to the following age restrictions:

- 14 years old and graduated from the 8th grade
- 15 years old regardless of grade level
- Must have not obtained 18 years of age or graduated from high school/GED program (whichever is later).
- Be a US citizen or legal permanent resident

Physical Requirements: Must be in good health and able to participate in activities safely. Every effort will be taken to ensure reasonable accommodations if available. The LPSO does not discriminate against anyone based on race, religion, color, gender identity, national origin, citizen status, ancestry, sexual orientation, marital status, political affiliation, or disability.

Residency: Must live within Lafayette Parish

Academic Standing: Must have and maintain a minimum of a 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) in high school or GED program while participating in the Explorer Post.

Letter of Recommendation: Applicants must obtain a letter of recommendation from a non-relative familiar with the applicant's behavior and work ethic. Examples include teachers, counselors, clergy, or current school resource officer.

Explorer Requirements

- Attend a minimum 65% of scheduled training events/Explorer meetings, as evaluated quarterly
- Participate a minimum of 50% of assignments/activities, as evaluated bi-annually
- Must conform with the LPSO Explorer's Post rules and regulations.

PARTICIPATION WAIVER AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The Lafayette Parish Sheriff's Office ("LPSO") is committed to conducting its programs and activities in a safe manner and holds the safety of participants in high regard. The Lafayette Parish Sheriff's Office continually strives to reduce risk and insists that all participants follow safety rules and instructions that are designed to protect the participants' safety. However, participants and parents/guardians of minors registering for the Law Enforcement Explorer Program (the "Program") must recognize that there is an inherent risk of injury when choosing to participate in the Program.

You are solely responsible for determining if your minor child participant (hereinafter referred to as the "Participant") is physically fit and/or adequately skilled for the activities contemplated by the Program. It is always advisable, especially if the Participant is disabled in any way or recently suffered an illness, injury or impairment, to consult a physician before undertaking any physical activity.

WARNING OF RISK

The Program is intended to challenge and engage the physical, mental and emotional resources of each participant. Despite careful and proper preparation, instruction, medical advice, conditioning and equipment, there is still a risk of serious injury when participating in any activity during the Program. Understandably, not all hazards and dangers can be foreseen. Depending on the particular activity, participants understand certain risks, dangers and injuries due to inclement weather, slip and falls, poor skill level or conditioning, carelessness, horseplay, unsportsmanlike conduct, premises defects, inadequate or defective equipment, inadequate supervision, instructional officiating, and all other circumstances inherent to indoor and outdoor recreational activities exist. In this regard, it must be recognized that it is impossible for the Lafayette Parish Sheriff's Office to guarantee absolute safety.

PHOTO/VIDEO POLICY

LPSO takes photos and video of participants before, during and after activities conducted as part of the Program. By signing this form, you are giving permission to LPSO to use these photographs and/or video images of your child for media coverage, on the LPSO website, social media outlets, and/or for any other use deemed appropriate by the Sheriff and LPSO. All photos and video are the property of LPSO.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF ALL CLAIMS AND LIABILITY

Please read this form carefully and be aware that in signing up and participating in the Law Enforcement Explorer Program, you (as parent or guardian of the minor child) will be expressly assuming the risk and legal liability and waiving and releasing all claims for injuries, damages or loss which you or your minor child/ward



might sustain as a result of participating in any and all activities connected with and associated with the Program, including transportation services and vehicle operations, when provided.

I recognize and acknowledge that there are certain risks of physical injury to participants in the activities in the Program, and I voluntarily agree to assume the full risk of any and all injuries, damages or loss, regardless of severity, that my minor child/ward or I may sustain as a result of said participation. I further agree to waive and relinquish all claims I or my minor child/ward may have (or accrue to me or my child/ward) as a result of participating in the Program against the Lafayette Parish Sheriff's Office, including its officials, agents, volunteers and employees.

I have read and fully understand the above important information, warning of risk, assumption of risk and waiver and release of all claims. If registering on-line or via fax, my on-line or facsimile signature shall substitute for and have the same legal effect as an original form signature.

LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING UNIT

THE CORE SAFETY RULES:

- 1. Treat All Firearms as Loaded at All Time
- **____2. Muzzle Discipline**: Always keep your muzzle pointed in the <u>safest direction</u> and never intentionally cross anything you are not prepared to shoot.
 - A Safe Direction is one where NO injury and only minor property damage could occur if an unintentional round is fired.
 - "Laser Rule" Imagine your handgun has a laser beam extending from the muzzle and whatever it touches could be shot.
- _____3. Trigger Finger: Always keep your trigger finger straight on the frame of the gun unless the muzzle is pointed at something you are prepared to shoot.
 - The trigger finger is <u>only</u> placed into the trigger guard and on the trigger when coming on target just before firing. When not firing, place your trigger finger <u>straight on the frame</u>. If the trigger finger is held just outside the trigger guard, rather than on the frame, a Convulsive Hand Grip could cause the trigger finger to fire the gun.
- _____4. Be Sure of your Target, the Surroundings, and Beyond: While targets on a square range are easily identifiable, threats on the street are often in close proximity or in front of innocent bystanders.

OTHER RANGE SAFETY RULES

- 5. It is <u>everyone's responsibility</u> to keep himself, and everyone else, safe. Safety must be a personal commitment by everyone at all times.
 - Anytime you observe a potentially unsafe condition developing, it is your responsibility to correct the matter or immediately call **CEASE FIRE**.
 - Upon hearing CEASE FIRE, immediately stop shooting, remain in position, repeat the CEASE FIRE command, and await further instructions.
- _____6. The Prime Directive: Keep your handgun secured in the holster and your long gun slung at all times unless specifically directed otherwise. This applies to the range and classroom environment and <u>not on the street</u>.



- **8.** Alcohol, Drugs, & Firearms Do Not Mix: Persons under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not be allowed to participate in any shooting exercises. Even non-prescription drugs can impair the shooter's ability to safely handle or shoot a firearm.
 - If you are taking any prescription or non-prescription drug or there is any physical condition/problem that should be noted, <u>you must advise an instructor</u> in private BEFORE going to the range.
- **9.** No Bending Over on the Range: It presents the top of your head to fire, cuts down on your field of vision, and is a poor tactic. If you need something on the ground, you will notify an instructor. The instructor will advise when it is safe, begin the "down range" call, and observe you retrieve the item. You will keep your torso upright and squat or kneel to retrieve the item. If the item is nowhere near the firing line, you will always squat or kneel to retrieve items.
- ______10. No Ammunition is allowed in the Cleaning Area: If a designated cleaning area is used, all firearms and magazines will be <u>unloaded</u> in the designated <u>loading/unloading area</u>, and checked to make sure they are clear of any ammunition before entering the cleaning area. Weapon muzzles will <u>always</u> be pointed in the safest direction.
- _____11. Safe Actions: Various training actions (i.e. taking a step sideways after firing, moving to range cover, kneeling to reload) that are conducted on the range are acceptable provided they are <u>safe</u>.
- _____12. Leaving the Firing Line: You must advise a Firearms Instructor if you are going to leave the line and the reason.
- _____13. All Equipment on the Person: Come to the line with ALL the equipment you will need. Be as practical as you can be.
- _____14. Report Injuries: Report any injuries, no matter how minor, to a Firearms Instructor as soon as practicable.
- _____15. Weapon to be Unloaded with the Action Open before Handing or Receiving: The <u>unloaded</u> firearm's action must be open before handing it to anyone or receiving it from anyone. If the weapon is magazine fed, the magazine must also be removed.
