LOUISIANA CRIME VICTIMS' BILL OF RIGHTS

- Under Louisiana's Crime Victim Bill of Rights, victims have the right to the following:
- The right to reasonable notice and to be present and heard during all critical stages of preconviction and post-conviction proceedings.
- The right to be informed of any changes in the custody status of the accused or the offender (ex: bond, escape, transfer to another facility, etc.)
- The right to confer with the prosecution prior to the final disposition of the case.
- The right to refuse to be interviewed by the accused or a representative of the accused.
- The right to review and comment upon the presentence report prior to the imposition of sentencing.
- The right to seek restitution.
- The right to reasonably prompt conclusion of their case.

SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE LAFAYETTE PARISH SHERIFF'S OFFICE VICTIM SERVICES PROGRAM

- Ensuring victims receive prompt emergency, social, and medical services
- Distributing the Victim Notice and Registration Form to victims who are eligible for registration
- Providing private settings for the interviewing of victims
- Notifying properly registered victims of the release
 of those accused or convicted from custody
- Informing employers that victim cooperation in investigations may require them to miss work

- Maintaining the confidentiality of all victims
- Assisting in the return of any stolen or other personal property to victims or their families when it is no longer needed as evidence
- Referring victims to local service organizations for counseling and financial services

CRIME VICTIM REPARATIONS PROGRAM

The Louisiana Crime Victims Reparations Program was established as a possible source of financial assistance for certain out-of-pocket expenses victims incur as a direct result of certain crimes (ex: medical expenses, funeral expenses, mental health expenses, lost wages, etc.).

Victims can only request assistance with out-of-pocket expenses not reimbursable through any other source (ex: insurance, restitution, civil suits, etc.).

You may be eligible to apply for victim compensation if you are the victim of a violent crime or the person responsible for the victim's expenses or the victim's dependent. In order to be eligible to file a claim, the victim must report the crime to law enforcement and cooperate with the investigation and prosecution of the crime.

It is NOT required that the offender be arrested and/or convicted.

You must apply for Crime Victim Reparations through the Sheriff's Office in the parish where the crime occurred. For a complete list of CVR Claims Investigators throughout the state, go to www.lcle.la.gov or call 225-342-7756.
